Due to printing mistakes in the Administrative measure n. 6 of May 17<sup>th</sup> 2005

announces

an open competition to establish a ranking for admission to the first year of the  
Laurea Specialistica (two year Master's Degree in European and International Studies –  
School of International Studies – University of Trento; for academic year 2005-2006,  
admissions are limited to 90 students.

ART. 1 – PUBLIC SELECTION

The University of Trento, School of International Studies, Laurea Specialistica (two  
year Master's Degree in European and International Studies, announces a public selection  
by written test to establish a ranking for admission to the first year of the Laurea Specialistica  
(two year Master's Degree in European and International Studies – Class 60/S –  
International Relations. Admission for academic year 2005-2006 is limited to 90 students,  
including a maximum of 10 posts for non- EU students residing abroad according to the  
quota established by Ministerial Circular ref. no. 658 21 March 2005.

The Laurea Specialistica (two year Master's Degree Course is an interdisciplinary  
course that offers teaching in the fields of economics, law, sociology, political science, and  
history. Three different courses of study are offered: economics, law, and political-social  
sciences.

## ART. 2 – ADMISSION TO THE SELECTION

Applications for pre-enrolment to participate in the selection test indicated in Art. 1 above are accepted from:

- 1) graduates who have four- or three-year university degrees or other degrees awarded abroad and recognized as equivalent and who do not have more than 30 unearned required credits in their selected course of study;
- 2) students enrolled in four- or three-year university degree programs in fields other than Economics and Social Sciences (class 28), European and Transnational Law (class 31) and European Society, Politics and Institutions (class 36) at the University of Trento or at another University who are missing no more than **17** credits towards their degrees and who will graduate by December 2005 and who, upon graduation, will not have more than 30 unearned required credits in their selected course of study;
- 3) students enrolled in a fully recognized three-year university degree course (class 28 – Economics and Social Sciences, class 31 – European and Transnational Law, class 36 – European Society, Politics and Institutions) at the University of Trento and students enrolled in a four- or three-year university degree courses at the University of Trento or another university who, at the time of graduation, have no unearned credits and who are missing no more than **17** credits towards their degrees and who will graduate by December 2005.

To apply for pre-enrolment to participate in the selection, candidates must present a self-certification with the list of exams and grades obtained; candidates who have not yet graduated must present a list of the exams they still have to pass, along with an indication of the credits and scientific disciplinary field for each didactic activity.

The course is open, under the same conditions, to students who are Italian citizens, citizens of a European Union country, or citizens of a non-European Union country regularly living in Italy and holding a degree awarded in Italy or an equivalent foreign qualification.

Candidates must meet these requirements for admission by the deadline for presentation of the pre-enrolment application (31 August 2005).

Students who intend to transfer from another specialist degree course at the University of Trento or to transfer from another university must nonetheless present an application for pre-enrolment for admission to the selection process. The Laurea Specialistica (two year Master's Degree Course) can only be entered after passing the selection test.

The Admissions Committee, indicated in Art. 5 below, will evaluate requirements and certify equivalency of candidates' degrees or foreign qualifications.

## ART. 3 – ENROLMENT IN THE SELECTION TEST

**Applications for admission**, compiled on the prescribed pre-enrolment form, must indicate the selected course of study, list examinations taken and to be taken and the grades obtained, as well as include descriptions of courses taken at other universities, and any additional information useful for evaluating the candidate's prior career. This information must be presented between **1 June and 12:00 noon on 31 August 2005** at the pertinent Student Services Office (Presidi didattici) (Faculty of Economics for the course in economics, Faculty of Law for the course in law, and Faculty of Sociology for the course in political-social sciences) of the Division of Teaching and Student Services , Via Inama, 5 - 38100 Trento.

Applications for admission must include the tax number (codice fiscale), a photocopy of the candidate's identity card, or the Italian permit/ card for foreign citizens (permesso/carta di soggiorno).

Application forms are available at the Division of Teaching and Student Services at the Student Services Office of the Faculties of Economics, Law, and Sociology and on-line at [http://www.unitn.it/didattica/info\\_studenti/modulistica.htm#9](http://www.unitn.it/didattica/info_studenti/modulistica.htm#9) or at the web page of the School of International Studies (<http://www.ssi.unitn.it/ls/index.htm>).

For foreign candidates, all documents presented with the application must be in English or Italian.

It is also possible to submit applications by registered mail. In this case, applications must be received by 12:00 noon on 31 August 2005. Late applications will be not accepted.

#### ART. 4 – SELECTION TEST

Admission to the first year of the Laurea Specialistica (two year Master's Degree Course in European and International Studies, within the set number of positions, depends upon the passing of a written test that assesses the adequacy of the candidate's knowledge of economics, law, political science, sociology, and history. In addition, candidates must pass an English language proficiency test.

##### **The selection tests are scheduled as follows:**

To be admitted to the test, the candidates must show a valid form of identification.

##### **Selection criteria:**

The selection will be based on candidates' educational curricula, the results of the selection test, the results of the English language test, and any other relevant documents presented with pre-enrolment applications.

#### Art. 5 – ADMISSION COMMITTEE

The Admission Committee, appointed by the Director of the School of International Studies, consists of five members selected from the professor whose areas of expertise are relevant to the selection test.

#### ART. 6 – RANKING

The ranking of those admitted to the Laurea Specialistica (two year Master's Degree Course in European and International Studies will be posted on the bulletin board of the

faculties involved and on the bulletin board at the Division of Teaching and Student Services, Via Inama, 5 - 38100 Trento. It will also be published on the School of International Studies page of the University web site ([www.unitn.it/ssi/index.htm](http://www.unitn.it/ssi/index.htm)) within fourteen days of the date of the selection test.

#### ART. 7 – MATRICULATION

The short-listed students can apply for matriculation to the first year of the Laurea Specialistica (two year Master's Degree Course in European and International Studies. Their applications must be presented to the Student Services Office of the appropriate faculty, Via Inama, 5 38100 Trento, along with a receipt indicating payment of the first instalment of tuition (payment can be made by Automatic Teller Machine directly at the Division of Teaching and Student Services or by bank transfer).

Students who already hold a degree must matriculate by 12:00 noon on 30 September 2005. Any candidate who does not matriculate by this date will be considered to have renounced his/her post and the next applicant on the ranked list will be offered admission.

Those who will be graduating by December 2005 must present their applications for matriculation along with a receipt indicating payment of the first instalment of tuition by 12:00 noon on 30 December 2005. After this date, no further enrolments will be accepted.

Students holding foreign degrees must present their documentation to the Foreign Students Office – Via Inama, 5 – 38100 Trento – and provide all required information and documents to allow evaluation of the credits of their foreign degree by the person responsible for the course of study or a delegated representative.
